CALIFORNIA AGRICULTURE TEACHERS'

This past summer one of our Agriculture teachers, Mark Powell, was awarded the Teacher of Excellence Award.



This award is given to agriculture teachers who have ASSOCIATION TEACHER OF EXCELLENCE taught for 10 years or more and is based on their work in all three circles of ag education. This award is only bestowed upon 20 teachers each year. Powell has been teaching for 14 years now which 12 of them he has spent working at Santa Maria High School. He is a Santa Maria alumnus part the graduating class of 2002 and was in the FFA program for all his four years in high school. He is the coach of the Dairy Products Judging Team. He has had great success coaching his team which has inevitably led his team to win nationals in 2015. Alongside obtaining three state wins in years of 2015, 2017 and 2019. "As a student in his class and a member of his Dairy Judging Team I can say that he is very well deserving of this award, he has personally helped me to strive for better and to never second guess myself" states student Itzel Lopez



Five of our FFA Agriculture teachers have previously received the Teacher of Excellence award. This includes Marc Debernardi (2011), Shannon Powell (2021), Clemente Ayon (2012), Luis Guerra (2007), and Melissa Flory (2018). Mark Powell feels honored to have joined his fellow co-workers and friends in achieving this award.





The 2022-2023 school year was a rewarding one to Santa Maria FFA members as they had the opportunity to be certified for various fields like Agriscience Chemistry, Floriculture, Professional Communications, and Veterinary Medical Applications. Beginning this past April, online certifications were offered to close to 400 Santa Maria High students enrolled in Agriculture classes. Out of this number, 102 of them became proficient in Agriscience Chemistry, 112 in Floriculture, 25 in Professional Communications and 18 in the field of Vet Science. This brings our total of students certified in 2023 to a vast 260 students.

Senior Gabriela Cabrera took 3 out of the 4 certifications offered and became triple certified in such fields. She recalls "the time and effort it took for [her] to pass the certifications." Nevertheless, Cabrera feels proud of her work and looks forward to using the certifications to experience occupations of her interest.

Students proficient in these fields will now be able to put forth their skills into the world and like Floral Design teacher, Sara Araujo explains, "it will give [students] confidence to possibly pursue a job...[and] will actually have a certification that they could provide to a future employer showing that they do have the basic skills needed." Now, close to 300 students can, and will step forth to occupations and strive toward success.
